Now bids us share the gifts of earth.

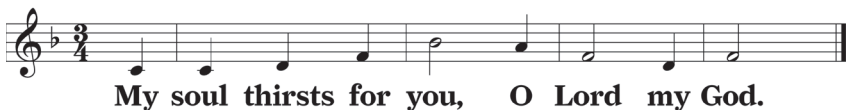
O Christ, our life from God most high,

*The paschal candle is lit. If you plan to use Psalm 141, prepare the thurible beforehand so that incense may be burned during the singing of the psalm.*

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit. **As it was in the beginning, is now, and will be for ever. Amen.**

# Prayer for Home & School

---

## Invitation to Prayer

*An adult or older child lights the prayer candle. The leader invites everyone to pray.*

We begin our prayer in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. *[All make the sign of the cross.]* **Amen.**

## Praise

*All sing a hymn of praise. Suggestions: Joy, Joy, Joy, and What Makes Love Grow? Hi God I; Day by Day and Children of the Light, Come and See (Born of the Spirit series); L'Arche Hymn.*

## Word of God

*A member of the group reads an appropriate verse(s) from the day's readings, concluding:*

The word of the Lord. **Thanks be to God.**

## Intercession

*The leader or another person leads the intercessions.*

God, Source of all life, we come to you with all our needs:

**R. God of life, hear us!**

God, fill us all with the spirit of charity: R.

God, call all nations to live in peace: R.

God, welcome all lonely persons into your heart: R.

God, give new life to those preparing for baptism: R.

God, take special care of those who are sick or dying: R.

God, hear our own needs (add specific needs as appropriate): R.

We pray with Jesus our brother:

**Our Father, who art in heaven,  
hallowed be thy name;  
thy kingdom come;  
thy will be done on  
earth as it is in heaven.**

**Give us this day our daily bread;  
and forgive us our trespasses  
as we forgive those who trespass against us;  
and lead us not into temptation,  
but deliver us from evil.**

God of all goodness, like a loving parent you care for all our needs. We place all our hope and trust in you. Help us to live in the joy and peace that your son, Jesus, brings to us. **Amen.**

### **Sign of Peace**

*The leader invites everyone to share a sign of peace.*

Let us offer each other a sign of Christ's peace.

*The celebration ends with the exchange of peace.*
